3. What was your first impression of Willy Burgdorfer? How does the author illuminate his strengths and appeal, as well as the darker side of his nature?

4. How did your opinion of Willy change over the course of the book?

5. Is it difficult to believe that this program was hidden for so long? Do you think the government should declassify the information related to these bioweapons?

6. Did you like the inclusion of photos throughout the story? How did that add to your understanding? Which photos were most impactful?
